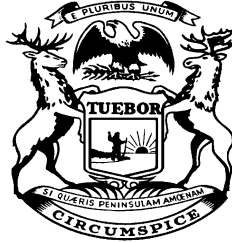


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**NOTICE OF DISBARMENT**

Suspension - Disbarment, Effective April 23, 2026

In a reciprocal discipline proceeding filed pursuant to MCR 9.120(C), the Grievance Administrator filed a certified copy of an order from the California Supreme Court issued September 11, 2025, disbaring respondent from the practice of law, effective September 11, 2025, in the matter titled *In re Aaron Spolin*, Case Nos. SBC-24-O-30656; SBC-24-O-30844; S292012.

An order regarding imposition of reciprocal discipline was issued by the Board and served on the parties on October 22, 2025, ordering the parties to inform the Board in writing, within 21 days from service of the order, (i) of any objection to the imposition of comparable discipline in Michigan based on the grounds set forth in MCR 9.120(C)(1), and (ii) whether a hearing was requested. On November 19, 2025, respondent filed a letter of objection with the Board, and a request to submit additional briefing on the issue. Upon respondent's objection, this matter was assigned to Tri-County Hearing Panel #7 for disposition, pursuant to MCR 9.120(C)(3).

The panel denied respondent's request for additional briefing, finding that respondent was afforded due process in the disciplinary proceedings conducted by the California State Bar, and that it would not be clearly inappropriate to impose comparable discipline in Michigan. On April 1, 2026, the panel issued an order disbaring respondent from the practice of law in Michigan, effective April 23, 2026. Costs were assessed in the amount of \$1,510.73.
